A STORY OF HOPE

In 2015, Executive Director/Co-founder Hubert Nolen came across a promotion video featuring a young woman on the verge of taking her own life because of heartache she had lived through but found hope at the Dream Center in Los Angeles, CA where she was given a second chance. In February 2016, Pastor Hubert Nolen transitioned from his position as Senior Pastor at Brookville Road Community Church, a church he had pastored for over 33 years. Hope Center Indy was created as a Christ-centered campus focused on healing the personal and building the professional lives of women exiting human trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation.

During Pastor Nolen's transition, a 25-acre campus located just one mile down the road from Brookville Road Community Church, opened up for sale. The stunning campus featured 35 offices, six classrooms, a computer lab, commercial kitchen and cafeteria, 300-seat auditorium, animal barn, greenhouse, coffee shop, and 50 residential rooms. A nine-month negotiation took place and in late September 2016 a lease agreement was finally reached.

Pastor Hubert Nolen along with his son David Nolen moved into their offices at the new Hope Center Indy campus in late October 2016. The campus had a number of needs that required attention before opening a residential program, but God provided for every need that came across Hope Center Indy's way.

In August 2017, only 10 months after moving into our campus, we received our first residents. Since then, over 50 women have benefited from our human trafficking program. We have now added three additional residential programs on campus targeting substance abuse and other life-threatening issues as well as 11 outreach ministries imparting hope to the many hurting hearts in our community.

In 2018, we were overwhelmed with the support from our community through volunteerism, donations, and financial support. As we move past 2019 into 2020, we continue to be optimistic and stand firm in the promise that through us, God will open more doors, break chains, and heal the lives of the courageous people we serve.

Residential Programs

S.O.S. (Sisters of Survival)

A recovery program offering housing, food, clothing, life and employment skills, education, and overall well-being support for women survivors of human sex trafficking. (18+) Facilitated by Hope Center Indy

SUSTAINABILITY

In the last three years, Hope Center Indy has created four in-house fundraisers and one is currently in the construction stages. All these areas are designed to help with the sustainability of the organization through purchases and donations of our community as well as provide a skills training area where the women in our program can develop employable skills.

The Redefined Hope Boutique and Coffee Shop's purpose is to provide clothing for the women recovering at our campus, give financial support to the program, and coach the women in entrepreneurship. Our coffee shop is located inside the boutique space and equally serves as a fundraiser and skills training area.

<u>The Freedom Barn Weddings & Events Center</u> is a historic 5,000 square foot, 2-story brick barn, designed for weddings, corporate events, private events, and ministry functions. A portion of the fees collected benefits our residents' transition to freedom and wholeness.

<u>The Blooming Hope Greenhouse</u> serves as a space to grow food in, but also functions as a demonstration area where our residents are learning how to start seeds, transplant and tend to crop, harvest their own food, as well as learn small business skills. Flowers, plants, fruits and vegetables can be purchased on site and will directly impact the program.

<u>A Beauty Salon</u> (Construction Stages) will serve as an area for our residents who have an interest in the cosmetology industry to shadow licensed cosmetologists in addition to giving financial support to Hope Center Indy. Program residents will receive beauty services for free.

Other sustainability sources:

Rentable spaces include a cafeteria and a newly renovated ballroom. Yearly fundraisers such as the spring and fall fashion shows can help raise upwards of \$50,000 combined. Additionally, community partners bring volunteers on site to renovate spaces and donate funds to help advance our mission.
